31st Annual Tokyo Video Festival Finale celebrates last TVF, lowering curtain on proud history JVC to Hold TVF2009 in YOKOHAMA with Award Winners and Video Fans

Selection Screening to be held on February 28, Awards Ceremony on March 1 at Yokohama's Landmark Hall

JVC (Victor Company of Japan, Limited) is pleased to announce that the company will hold "TVF in YOKOHAMA," the final main event of the 31st Tokyo Video Festival (TVF2009), on Saturday, February 28 and Sunday, March 1 at Landmark Hall in Yokohama. Supported by the City of Yokohama, the event is free of charge to the public.

TVF will hold A "Selection Screening & Talk" on the first day, in which special guests Hakudo Kobayashi and Hiroaki Sato from The TVF 2009 Judging Committee will screen and discuss their favorite works from the 100 honorees. Capping the second day will be announcement of the "Video Grand Prize" and "JVC Grand Prize" winners, as well as winners of three "People's Awards" chosen by the general public through a special vote on the TVF web site.

Confident that TVF achieved its goals over the last three decades, JVC decided to make this year's event the final one for TVF. ■ About JVC Tokyo Video Festival (TVF)

- JVC has held this international, open-participation video festival annually since 1978, attracting approximately 50,000 entries over the last three decades. TVF's purpose is twofold: to open new vistas in free expression through video, and to popularize video culture.
- The festival is open to individuals and groups, both professional and amateur, of all nationalities, ages and gender. All entries must be produced with a video camera. Playback time must not exceed 20 minutes. Subject matter is not restricted
- In 2004, JVC received the Japan Mecenat Award for Video Exploration from the Association for Corporate Support of the Arts. Mecenat Awards are presented to companies and corporate foundations that make a significant contribution to the arts.
- TVF2009 is affiliated with a number of other video festivals in Japan and abroad.
